




#Lanz (8,319 posts)


The **Russian Embassy to Germany** has <u>posted</u> a statement by Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov in support of Telegram founder Pavel Durov, whose arrest in Paris on 08/24 he framed as emblematic of France's overall problematic position on freedom of speech.

The PRC's Embassy to Germany has posted no new content.

German Chancellor **Olaf Scholz** posted a video in which he reiterated his demand to curb irregular immigration, but without infringing on Basic Law.
